



Day 3 Itinerary: Clarity and Excellence

Breakfast: We start the day with a relaxed group breakfast at the hotel before heading out.

Morning: Discovering the British Museum

Activity Overview:

We start the day by immersing ourselves in the rich history of the British Museum. Participants will engage in interactive tasks designed to connect ancient civilizations with modern skills.

Task: Decoding the Past

Participants work in teams to select an artifact or exhibit that embodies one of the following themes: communication, collaboration, or creativity in ancient civilizations.

- Each team crafts a brief narrative about how their chosen artifact demonstrates this theme and relates it to a modern context (e.g., teamwork in ancient trade networks compared to today's global economy).
- Findings are presented in 2-minute pitches, focusing on clarity and engagement.

Skills Developed:

- **Communication:** Conveying ideas effectively and succinctly.
- **Critical Thinking:** Analyzing historical artifacts for relevance to modern challenges.
- **Collaboration:** Team-based research and presentation.

Guided Discussion: Excellence in Preservation

Participants will debate the role of museums in preserving cultural artifacts, exploring how museums balance their commitment to excellence in curation with ethical considerations of ownership.

Skills Developed:

- **Commitment to Excellence:** Examining standards and ethical practices.
- **Critical Thinking:** Evaluating diverse perspectives.

Lunch: We enjoy our dining experience with globally inspired dishes at Foley's in Fitzrovia and discuss how historical communication or collaboration strategies (e.g., early trade networks) parallel modern practices in your field or studies?



Afternoon: Covent Garden Walking Tour and Urban Mobility Challenge

Activity Overview:

After lunch, we head to Covent Garden Piazza for a private walking tour exploring the transport heritage and innovation that shaped London.

Walking Tour Highlights: London Transport Museum (exterior), Jubilee Market Hall, Somerset House, Waterloo Bridge, and Charing Cross Station.

Urban Mobility Challenge:

- **Briefing:** Teams reflect on insights from the walking tour and brainstorm solutions to transport challenges of the future, focusing on themes like inclusivity, sustainability, and technological innovation.
- **Group Task:** In small teams, design a futuristic transport concept for a fictional city in 2050 to be ready to present a 2-minute pitch outlining their concept's key features and impact.
- **Presentations:** Groups present their solutions, fostering discussion and peer feedback.

Skills Developed:

- **Creativity:** Generating imaginative, practical solutions.
- **Problem-Solving:** Addressing complex urban challenges with innovative ideas.
- **Collaboration:** Working in diverse teams to achieve a common goal.
- **Communication:** Presenting ideas clearly and persuasively.

Dinner: Darwin Brasserie at Sky Garden and we conclude the experience with a memorable dinner offering stunning views of London.

Reflection Exercise: Over dinner, participants share their “key takeaway” from the programme, focusing on one skill cluster they enhanced and how they plan to apply it moving forward.
